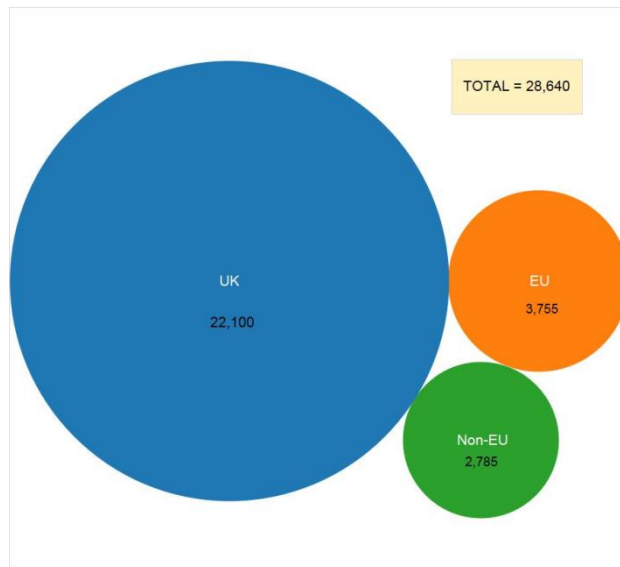


Overall figures¹

Overall 2013/14 mobility figures from UK higher education institutions²

- Total students studying abroad in 2013/14: 28,640
- Total UK: 22,100 (1.2%)
- Total UK mobilities: 24,695
- Total EU: 3,755
- Total non-EU: 2,785



Proportion of mobile students by institution

- Overall average: 1.2%
- Average proportion of UK-domiciled students: 1.2%
- Average proportion of UK-domiciled undergraduate students: 1.4%
- Average proportion of UK-domiciled undergraduate 2nd and 3rd year students: 2.5%

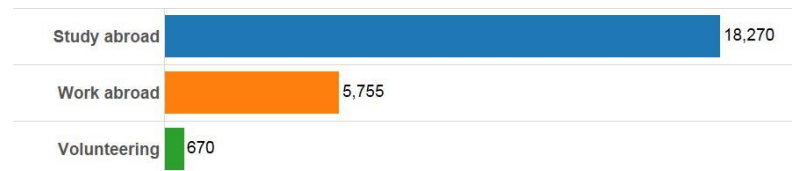

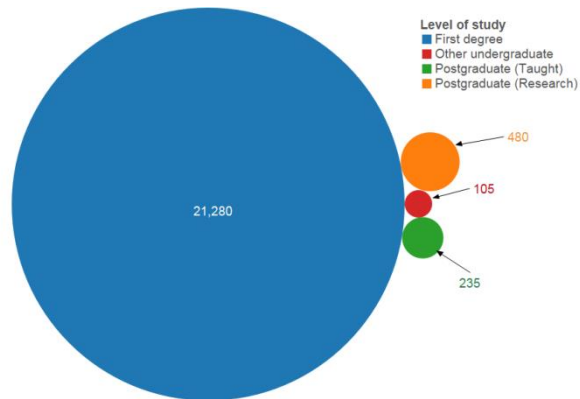

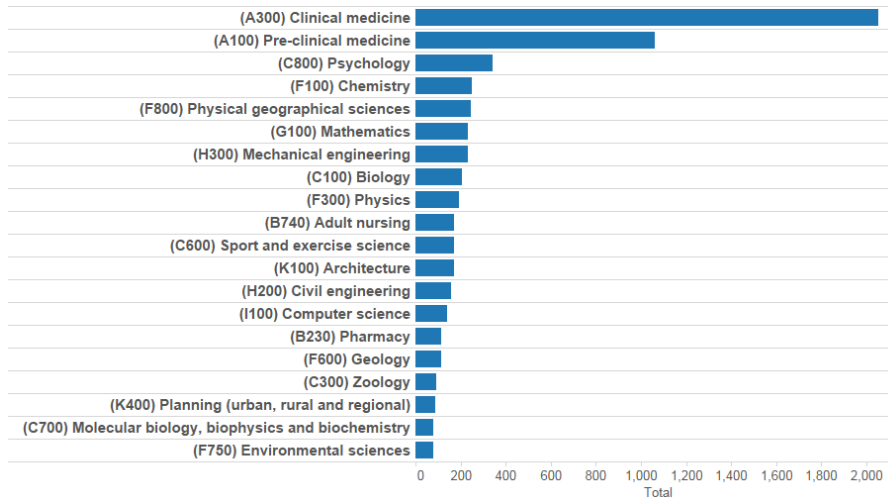

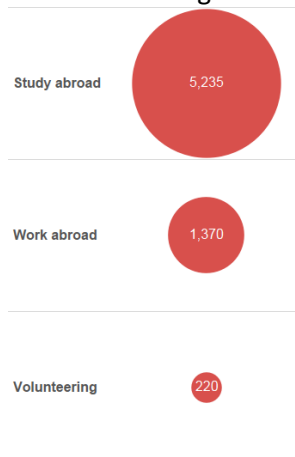

STEM – types of mobility

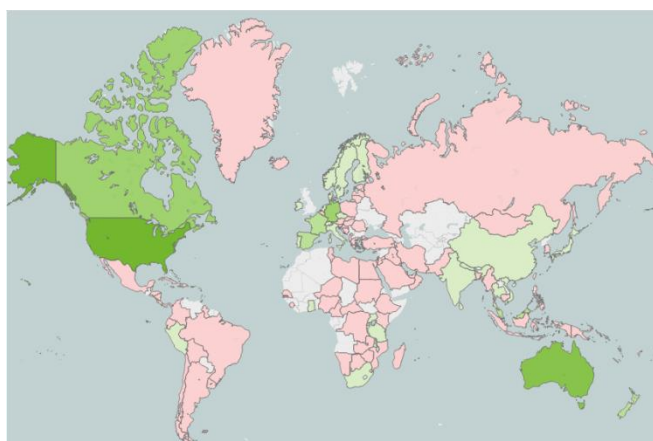
- Overall 6,825 mobilities across 6,785 students

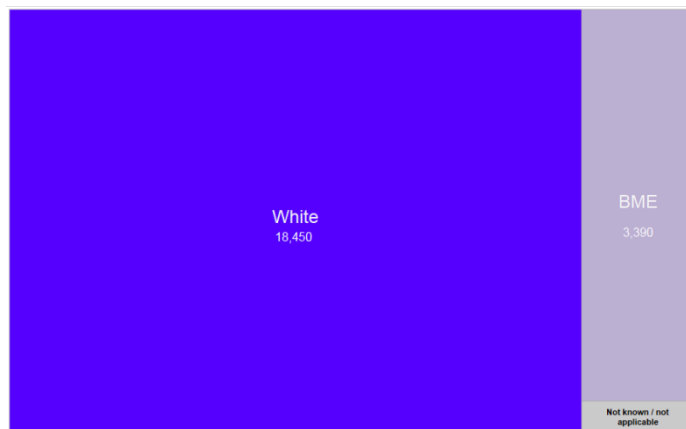
